## A toast at Timmy's

The Mikey Network recently donated six defibrillators to Tim Horton camps in Canada and the United States through the Tim Horton Children's Foundation (THCF), which provides encouragement, a positive environment and ongoing support for economically disadvantaged children. Camps are located in Parry Sound and St. George, Ontario; Kananaskis, Alberta; Tatamagouche, Nova Scotia; Quyon, Quebec and Campbellsville, Kentucky. Heathwood Homes and the

Heron Group of Companies established the Mikey Network in memory of friend and partner Mike Salem, who died of cardiac arrest while golfing in Muskoka in the summer of 2002. In his name, Mikey defibrillators are placed in as many public facilities as possible so that other cardiac arrest victims may have a second chance at life.
